Fellow members of CGISA, distinguished guests, once again thank you for being here today.

However, by working together and drawing on our collective expertise and experience, I am confident that we can rise to the occasion and ensure that South Africa's governance standards remain among the strongest in the world.

As we look forward to the future, we must also reflect on the past. CGISA has a proud history of promoting excellence in corporate governance, and it is our responsibility to build on that legacy. Whether through continued professional development, thought leadership, or advocacy, we must remain committed to our core values of integrity, accountability, and transparency.

In closing, I want to express my gratitude to all of you for your dedication to CGISA and to the principles of good governance. Your contributions, both big and small, make a real difference in shaping the future of corporate governance in Southern Africa and beyond.
